Historic Costume Assistant

Costume Assistants will sew identified pieces of clothing or textile materials necessary for the interpretive costume program. Historic costumes assist to recreate an authentic Victorian experience for visitors to Irving House. Costumes are selected and constructed to replicate authentic Victorian fashions. Historic costumes are an integral component of the interpretive program for Irving House and are worn by Interpretive Guides and Volunteers.

Activities

- Sew pieces of historic costumes.
- Fit and alter costumes for Interpretive Guides and Volunteers.
- Repair damaged or worn costume pieces.
- Clean and launder costumes.
- Research Victorian fashion history and assist to document styles, material types, stitching methods and accessories.
