My Uncle John sent you the news-paper you will see all about it in it. On Wednesday the 10th April I answered your

Letter & I sent you a paper about the (Home-
Rule Bill) But I found out latter on that
It did not get your length. They went in the
illfatted Ship Titanic So they are at the
bottom of the Sea. I suppose you heard off
the terrible disaster. the (Titanic Ship)
was built at Harland & Wolffs (Queen's-Island
Belfast. The Manger & foreman of the
Island went down with her

A great number of the Queen-Island
workmen were on her only one fellow
was saved. It has left great sorrow every
where. I think that I have little more
to say at present. Goodbye for the present
